The Bullis School of Potomac Maryland beat St. John's of Shrewsbury Massachusetts 64-62 in overtime. Freshman guard Joe Hazel of Bullis hit two three pointers in the last 20 seconds, the second one with 1.2 seconds left for the victory. Bullis opened up a 13 point lead in the first quarter, but St. John's fought back and took the lead in the third quarter when forward Richard Rogers grabbed an offensive rebound and hit a three pointer for a 36-35 St. John's lead. Bullis responded with a steal and layup by Senior Tex McLinton to take the lead back 37-36 and Bullis went on to score the last 8 points of the quarter to lead 43-36 after 3 quarters. St. John's fought back again and tied the score 57-57 when senior guard Brian Perron made one of two free throws

with 1:05 to play. Bullis played for the last shot in regulation and had two chances to win at the end, but Hazel missed a three pointer at the buzzer. Hazel didn't miss at the end of overtime however, as after Perron made one of two free throws for a 61-58 St. John's lead, Hazel nailed a three pointer with 20 seconds left for the tie and after St. John's junior guard David White made one of two free throws with 9.8 seconds left, Hazel nailed his game winner. St. John's was led by the tough defense and perimeter shooting of senior guard Anthony Trapasso (16 points), White (15 points) and inside play of senior Matt LaBove (16 points). Bullis was led by senior forward Robert McPherson (14 points) and McClinton (14 points).

DCIAA pre-season favorite Coolidge High School established its aggressive defense and rugged inside game early, led from the first basket and never looked back, defeating 2008 Virginia State Prep School Champion Benedictine HS, in the first round of the 20th Annual Gonzaga College High School DC Classic prep basketball tournament. Despite a substantial foul shooting advantage, cold-shooting Benedictine could not get untracked and trailed by seven at the half,

30-23. Coolidge came out firing in the third quarter, thanks to a balanced attack featuring 12 scorers, and increased its lead to as many as 11. Benedictine was led by Darien Brothers who finished with 25 points and led Benedictine to pull within five midway through the fourth quarter. Coolidge was never in danger, however, and pulled away to close the game on a seven point run. Coolidge was led by Garland Vinson's 12 points.
