From the start, this game between St. John's of Shrewsbury, MA and Archbishop Molloy of Briarwood, NY was a physical matchup on both ends of the floor. Both team's big men made their presence known early as St John's Matt Labove battled with Molloy's Jin Hong under the boards in the first quarter. The mid-court battle was also intense with several turnovers. Both

teams seem to force the ball for opportunities which lead to early fouls (15 total in the first half) and lots of long range shooting. St John's squandered several opportunities to score because of its inability to finish at the basket. This lack of finishing power by the Pioneers resulted in a 10 point lead for the Stanners, 40-30, at halftime. Molloy senior Russ Smith was 8 for 9 from the foul line with a total of 20 first half points.

Both teams seem to settle in after the break, satisfied to trade baskets, with Stanners getting the best of the trade, building up a 20 point lead. However, midway through the fourth quarter, Hong's fourth foul seemed to slow the Stanners defense. Pioneers made a small run cutting the lead to as few as 12. However, in the end the Stanners defense stiffened and they pulled away with Russ Smith leading the way with 34 points on the strength of 12 of 13 free throw shooting. Richard Rodger's took the scoring honors for the Pioneer with 17. The final score was 83-65 as Archbishop Molloy won 7th place overall leaving St John's with 8th place.

During the second quarter, senior guard Eric Atkins asserted himself by scoring 12 as the Gaels continued their trademark aggressive defensive game to lead 30-23 at halftime.

During the second half, the recipe of Atkins and aggressive defense was offered in an unrelenting dosage as the Gaels maintained a comfortable lead and thwarted any comeback attempt by the Cadets. Atkins finished with 22 for the Gaels while Hill and Reilly Beaumont added 16 and 13

The Gonzaga Eagles and St. John Cadets faced off in the finals of the Gonzaga DC Classic at American University's Bender Arena. Playing with a ferocity that has characterized this long-term rivalry, the first quarter saw several lead changes, close defense and numerous foul calls

placing several starters on the bench in foul trouble. At the end of the extremely competitive first quarter, the Cadets led 12-11.

Exhibiting a balanced offense and steadfast defense, the Eagles started to gain the advantage towards the end of the second quarter and led by 21-17 when Tim Snyder sank a clutch three pointer to draw his Cadets within one only to be answered by a 3 pointer by tournament MVP Cedric Lindsay. The Eagles led at halftime by 26-23.

The third quarter opened with the ferocious play at both ends of the court. When Tyler Thornton was forced to sit with his third foul early in the third quarter, Lindsay did a superb job running Gonzaga's offense while senior Patrick Wolf played the role of super-sub.

The Eagles opened the fourth quarter with a 4-0 run to take a commanding lead of 45-30 with 7 minutes remaining. St John's continued to press the Eagles but in the end had no answer for the superb guard tandem of Thornton and Lindsay and the inside dominance of senior Ian Hummer.

The Eagles had four players scoring in double figures led by Cedrick Lindsay's 17 points. Chris Martin and Julian DeBose lead the scoring for the Cadets with 8 points each.
