Point guard Brian Wetzal, the smallest player on the floor, keyed a late run by Dallas Jesuit, scoring 12 second half points, most of them in the paint, leading the Rangers to a 60-49 win over

Sidwell Friends in a second round consolation game in the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball Tournament at Gonzaga Friday afternoon. Both teams suffered throughout from cold shooting and Jesuit managed to get up on the Quakers by four at the half, thanks to the early inside play of forward Chris Udophia and center Josh Bauer and the outside shooting of forward James Leinbaugh. Sophomore guard Jamal Lewis kept Sidwell close with 8 points in the first half. In the second half, the Quakers rallied from eight points down to take the lead on a Lewis basket with 1:58 left but Wetzel immediately answered for Jesuit, hitting 3 straight baskets to push the Rangers out to a 10 point lead and holding off Sidwell for the win. Jesuit placed four players in double figures, led by Wetzel with 16, while Lewis led the Quakers with 19 points and freshman guard Matt Hilman added 12. The Rangers will play the winner of Iona Prep/Chantilly match up at AU's Bender Arena on Saturday at 4:15 PM while the Quakers will play in the seventh place game at 2:30 PM.

The Gaels started off strong jumping out to a 16-8 first quarter lead, but the Charges just kept on coming, led junior guard Kethan Savage's 15 points. Tied at half, the Chargers took control in the third quarter behind the timely three point shooting of senior forward Adam Fridy and junior guard Devin Ballam and led 46-41 going into the fourth quarter. The teams traded baskets for most of

the fourth quarter before the Gaels had to foul and the Chargers sank 19 of their game high 29 free throw attempts to seal the victory.
