In the Championship game of the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball tournament, Gonzaga beat Mater Dei of California in a thriller, 62-59. Gonzaga lead 26-24 at half, but Mater Dei exploded in the third period. Max Hooper hit three straight three pointers as the Monarchs built a 42-34 lead. Gary Franklin then hit back to back three's to extend the lead to 48-36. Malcolm Lemmons then made back to back lay-ups for the Eagles followed by a Cedrick Lindsay three pointer to cut the lead to 48-43. After Tyler Lamb made two foul shots and Franklin made a lay-up for the Monarchs, Cahli Thomas hit a three at the buzzer for the Eagle's to cut the lead to 52-46 at the end of the third.

In the fourth quarter, it was time for Gonzaga to take charge. Down 57-49, the Eagles went on a 11-0 scoring run. Nate Britt hit a three, Kris Jenkins and Lemmons followed with lay-ups and then Jenkins got an offensive rebound and a put back for a 58-57 Gonzaga lead. But Gonzaga wasn't done. Leading 59-57 Thornton stole the ball and went coast to coast for a 61-57 lead. After two Lamb free throws, Lemmons had a chance to ice the game with 10 seconds left, but made only one of two free throws. The Monarchs played for the last shot and when Franklin's three was short at the buzzer, the Eagles where Champions of the Gonzaga DC Classic for the fourth straight year.

Franklin led all scorers with 24 points and Lamb added 16 for the Monarchs. Gonzaga was led by the tournaments MVP, Tyler Thornton, who scored 18 points and Lindsay added 13.
