Stephon Diggs' seven 3-point field goals led Bishop McNamara (Forestville, Maryland) to victory over St. Rita of Cascia (Chicago, Illinois) by a score of 65-59 in today's second round consolation game at the Gonzaga D.C. Classic.

The first half was a back-and-forth affair, with no team getting more than a five point lead at any time. McNamara started quickly but turnovers allowed St. Rita's to keep the game close. For St. Rita's two players scored 21 of their 26 points: Cullen Fulks had 13 and Eddie Randell had 8 in the opening half. For Bishop McNamara, point guard Stephon Jiggets was able to take advantage of the St. Rita's zone, hitting four three-point shots on his way to 13 first-half points. The first half ended in a tie at 26.

In the second half, Bishop McNamara's defense put unrelenting pressure on St. Rita's, forcing them into shots they might not have taken in the first half. While shooting only 11 of 25 from the free-throw line, McNamara was able to win the contest on the boards. Leading scorers: For the victorious McNamara – Stephan Jiggets had 7 3-point field goals and finished with 22. Kelsey Jenkins had 16. For St. Rita's, Cullen Fulks finished

with 19. St. Rita's finished the game making 17 of 19 free-throw attempts which kept the game close.

Neumann -Goretti (Philadelphia, PA), led by Ja'Quan Newton with 28 points, defeated Sidwell Friends School (Washington, DC) tonight in the second semi-final game of the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball Tournament. The final score was 76-61. Neumann-Goretti will face Gonzaga College High School in the Sunday afternoon final at American University.

Neumann-Goretti's size-advantage and a deep bench made the difference for them throughout the game. The Philadelphia School, ranked top 25 in national polls, attracts some of the most talented basketball prospects in Philadelphia area. Neumann-Goretti had four players in double figures, including Newton, John Davis, Derrick Stewart and La'Q,uan Coaxum.

The foursome of Josh Hart, Matt Hillman, Phillip McGloin and Jamal Lewis are the clear leaders for Sidwell Friends. The group virtually did not leave the court throughout the game and combined for all but two of Sidwell's 61 points.
