Back to back three pointers by the Vikings junior forward Sam Calhoun and senior guard Mike Anselmo cut the lead to one with just over 6 minutes to play. But the Mustangs Victor Law's offensive rebound and layup ended the Vikings momentum. But the drama was still not over, as with just over seven seconds left in the game, trailing by 3, Calhoun stole the ball and the Vikings had a chance to tie, but senior forward Claude Scott's three pointer at the buzzer just missed. Hicks led all scorers with 19 points and sophomore guard Treston Forbes added 7 points and freshman guard Charles Mathews added 6 points for the Mustangs. Calhoun finished with 12 points and senior guard Lincoln Davis added 11 points for the Vikings.

The host Gonzaga Eagles edged the Saints of Philadelphia's Neumann-Goretti and won the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball Tournament for the 6th straight year this evening at American University's Bender Arena. In the first half it appeared that Gonzaga would run away with the game as they raced out to a 26-16 lead with 2:12 left in the 2nd quarter. But Neumann-Goretti held the Eagles scoreless for the rest of the half and hung tough in the 3rd quarter. Gonzaga guard Nate Britt was called for his 4th foul with the Eagles leading 36-29 in the 3rd quarter and the Saints kept chipping away at Gonzaga's lead and rallied to get within one point with 19.6 seconds left. But Gonzaga's Jordan Abdur Ra'oof scored on a dunk on the ensuing inbounds play and corralled the rebound on the Saints desperation three point attempt that followed. He was fouled but missed the free throw and time expired on the rebound. Forward Kris Jenkins led the Eagles with 20 points while Britt added 12. For the visiting Saints, Ja'Quan Newtown scored 15 while La'Quan Coaxum had 11.
