The Sagemont Lions of Weston Florida beat The John Carroll School of Bel Air, MD in overtime 74-70 in the first round of the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball Tournament. Despite the Lions junior Forward Vieux Kande and senior power forward Jeff Coby picking up four and three fouls respectively in the first half, they lead 31-27 behind sophomore guard Joe Kirby's 12 points. Freshman sensation Justin Jenifer hit three

three's in the first half and had 12 points to pace the Patriots. In the fourth quarter, sophomore guard Kamau Stokes hit a three to give the Patriots their only lead of the half, 47-46. The Lions junior guard Egor Koulechov, who lead all scorers with 31 points responded by then scoring the next 11 points for the Lions as they built the lead back to 4 points 57-53. But the Patriots, ranked 45th in the Nation by Powerade, would not fold. Trailing by three with just under 10 seconds to play, senior forward Jarred Jones buried a three from the corner to tie the score 66 and force overtime. Jones then made a layup to put the Patriots up 68-66. Coby then made a layup to tie it. Koulechov then made two more free throws and senior guard Victor Rohlf made a layup to put the Lions up 72-68 with 36 seconds left. After a layup by Jenifer with 14 seconds left the Patriots had to foul and fouled Koulechov who calmly sank two more free throws to seal the game. The Lions made 27 of 29 free throws for the game. The Lions will play the winner of the Gonzaga (Washington DC) verse Central Catholic (PA) game Saturday night at 6:45pm at American University's Bender Arena. The Pioneers will play in the first consolation game against the loser of the Gonzaga verse Central Catholic game at 3:15pm.

Gonzaga rode the hot shooting touch of Junior guard Nate Britt to break open a close game in the 4th quarter as the host Eagles beat the Vikings of Central Catholic from

Pittsburgh, PA, 74-64 in a first round game of the Gonzaga DC Classic Basketball Tournament. Britt scored 23 points in the first half and ended the game with 30 points to lead all scorers. Kris Jenkins added 12 points for Gonzaga while Central Catholic's Lincoln Davis led the Vikings with 21 points. Both teams came out red hot and they traded baskets on the way to a 42-38 Gonzaga halftime advantage. Britt made all of his shots in the first half until finally missing on a heave past the midcourt line as time was expiring. Central Catholic tired a bit at the end of the 3rd quarter and several turnovers enabled Gonzaga to stretch the lead to 6 points. Freshman guard Franklin Howard scored 8 second half points to give the host Eagles momentum going into the 4th quarter, where they stretched their lead to 12 points before holding on by 10 points. The Eagles will play The Sagemont School of Weston, FL in tomorrow's first semi-final game at American University's Bender Arena at 6:45 PM while Central Catholic will face off against John Carroll of Bel Air, MD in the consolation bracket at 3:15 PM.
